If what you really want is a printer to output a lot of text documents for business, etc., you probably still want to look into laser printers. If you want that capability, you wont find a laser model for less than ten times the cost of the MFC6490CW. Bear in mind, this printer really is very big. Its almost as big as a heavyduty office printer. It wont share a desk with your monitor and keyboard comfortably, and if you use a laptop it will loom over you like a monolith so make sure you have space for it. Setup was easy enough, although you may need to be a little savvy to successfully share the printer with several PCs over a network. I found it was safest to assign a static IP address to the printer and manually configure each PC to search for it at that address, rather than relying on the automatic setup. Another reviewer said you cant use wireless and wired networking at the same time.

To clarify, the printer will only use one network interface at a time if you enable the wireless networking on the printer it will disable the Ethernet and vice versa. But it makes no difference; the point is to use whichever interface is most convenient for you. If you plug the printer directly into the Ethernet port on a wireless router, you WILL still be able to access the printer from wireless devices. Likewise, you wont need to buy a wireless card for your desktop PC if you set up the printer on WiFi. Your wireless router will automatically bridge the wired and wireless networks. The printer is just giving you options. As for print quality, sorry folks, text output is NOT as good as a laser. Its not as fast, its not as sharp, its not as dark, its not as crisp bottom line, a laser printer is going to yield nicerlooking text documents. The again, text quality is very readable, and normalquality output on plain paper is quick enough for my needs. I realized that most of my prints are for my own files, or for me to mark up with a pen. Who am I trying to impress. Those of us who can still remember the days of dotmatrix printers should have no complaints. I would consider prints at normal quality mode to be fully acceptable for business use. The text becomes very sharp indeed if you use highquality inkjet paper and one of the printers photo modes, but thats too slow and expensive to be practical. I was pleasantly surprised by the graphics output, which I found to be rich, smooth, and clear. Outputting photos to plain paper showed noticeable banding, but thats to be expected. On the other hand, I printed out a document that had lots of areas of flat color and lots of gradients onto highquality 36 pound matte inkjet paper, and on that job I noticed ZERO, repeat ZERO banding in either the gradients or the flat areas.

If anything, the colors came out a little too dark and saturated, but I suspect that I used an overly optimistic print mode for the particular paper stock I had on hand. I have yet to try printing photographs at maximum quality onto glossy photo stocks, but I have no reason to doubt the quality of the output. I printed out a page of text on plain paper and on 36pound inkjet paper, then threw a bunch of water onto the pages. The plainpaper sheet did seem to blur a bit, but not as much as I expected. Black ink seemed to survive the test well, while colors bled quite a lot. On the heavy ink jet paper, however, there was almost no change once the inks dried. I would actually include the sheet that got wet in with other pages in a presentation; it survived that well. Laser printers still

have the advantage if you plan to take your prints out in the rain, but prints from this inkjet are no sissies. As others have noted, the printer isn't smart enough to know which kind of paper is in which tray. You need to configure it yourself, either on the panel on the front of the printer or via the configuration software. That's a small price to pay, however, and an example of the many minor compromises that Brother has made to keep the price of this printer at rock bottom. More annoying is the fact that there's no easy way to feed a single envelope without emptying out a paper tray. There is no automatic duplex scanning, copying, or printing, but I have never owned a printer that would do these things. Unlike others, the automatic document feeder ADF worked smoothly for me. The scanner was a treat. I had a lowcost tabloid scanner already Mustek A3 USB but this Brother scanner is far better. It's fast, even when scanning over the network. And it's clever you don't even have to initiate a scan on your PC. You can put a document onto the scanner, push the button, and have the scanner send the output TO your computer. On a network, you can even pick WHICH computer to send the scan to.

The included OCR software read a twopage document with zero errors. The only minus I've noticed is that the scanner drivers don't come with any kind of descreening filters, so you'll need thirdparty software to clean up scans from magazines or other fourcolor images. On the whole, there are probably better choices if all you want to do is print lettersized pages, but if you're in the market for tabloid printing or scanning, this device really can't be beat. I believe this printer would serve any small business well. One more note Brother has actually included highcapacity inkjet cartridges with this printer, rather than the halffull cartridges you get from some manufacturers. The print quality is there, the features, good inks, etc but the haphazard printer drivers and the dictatorial printer software make this tool a sore spot in an otherwise complete home computing experience. On our Windows Vista desktop no matter how we set up the print drivers the Brother printer will not send a print job through until reboot. This occurred somewhere in 2010 when MSFT updated Vista and Brother didn't update their driver properly. This essentially removed one of our home systems from ever being able to print aside from the few random prints that emerge after a monthly reboot. This seems like this would be a good machine but the quirks and poor software have made owning this a frustrating experience and regrettable purchase. Please try again later. Order one off amazon if you're planning to connecting it so it arrives at the same time. When the printer runs out of an ink cartridge, it will not print in any color. I have yet to have a paper jam, even when using glossy and semigloss paper. This printer does not print side by side, which I knew about when I purchased it. I now wish I had spent a little more on the version that does do this. While it copies from a feeder, it does not print from one, which would have been very convenient for doing fast prints of things like envelopes. It took me a very long time to figure out how to scan a document 11x17. It does do as advertised, you just have to tweak the settings. Overall, the scans are okay if you are not are only scanning documents. If you are an artist, I would recommend getting a real scanner because the results from this are rather poor. Very low contrast and whitewashed images, no matter how you tweak it. The software for this is useless and insists on booting up every time you connect the machine. I don't know why I installed it in the first place. The wireless network seems to not want to work in a secured network. I want to mention that I did not find this machine to be noisier than other small ones I've previously owned. It does make some noise, but not enough to annoy me or wake the cat up. Overall, this is a good printer for the price. It is not in heavy use so I expect to have it for a long time. It's easy to use, albeit a little slow and it has been frustration free

for me other than the installation, so I would recommend this to anyone looking for an affordable printer than can do almost all with decent quality. If you are looking for a SUPER FAST, SILENT, SIDESIDE PRINTING, FLAWLESS SCANNING and SMALL device this is not the choice you want to make. 2014 UPDATE EDIT I have had this machine since 2010. I took a gamble when I bought it, because I had it shipped overseas and it would have been impossible to return it if it had ended up being a dud.

At this point I thought I should make an update. So far, the machine has not given me any problems. Its a very solid, reliable product. I printed my architecture thesis on this. 4 books. 300 pages each, side by side. It took quite a bit of planning around but I managed to make it work. Again, I still wish I had bought the sidebyside print version. After all that heavy printing, I only had 2 paper jams. Like I mentioned, this doesnt print if any of the cartridges have run out of ink. Very impractical but i ended up resolving this by.I ended up buying offbrand XL refill ink cartridges to use on it. They last a very long time, as they the capacity equivalent of 4 regular cartridges. Because they extend beyond the space in the compartment, I ended up having to rig the closing mechanism with a piece of plastic and a bit of tape. The printer will not print if it detects the cartridge door is open. It only took 3 years, but I was finally able to install this over a wireless network after moving it to my office. It works like a dream. Have also been able to effortlessly install this in two home PCs and imac and macbook pro with no issues. After 5 years, printing from the top feeder results in faint lines of black ink in the middle of the printed paper. They appear at random intervals. Think, what printer can you use for 5 years without ever having to call costumer service. This will be my first time contacting them to try to figure out what is causing it. Since I hardly use the top feeder its not a pressing issue at the moment. Would I make some changes to this printer Yes. Every time you turn it on to copy, it defaults to the fax menu. It will stack maybe 10 sheets before it falls. Thats because the size of the tray in that configuration is too small for A3 paper or larger. If you use the piece that extends off the tray to catch the it, the paper will bend in an arch because it doesnt fit in that space. You have to stand there collecting it.

Pros I scan a lot of articles into Nuances PaperPort for ease of future access and searching. The scanner will handle a full page of the tabloid size trade magazines. The scanner is also ready to go without any lamp warmup which saves time. Previously I had to tape together lettersize sheets or email the drawings to a print shop and then drive to the store to get them. I dont fax often but the options menu on the Brother is intuitive enough that I dont need to pull out the manual each time that I want to send a nonstandard fax. This AIO has all of the common fax functions. Setting up the printer on my home network wired was painless. All three computers recognized the printer and loaded the appropriate drivers on the first attempt. Cons The color saturation and accuracy on the scanner is not great. When scanning photos or slides I still use the old Epson Perfection 1240U. It takes a little time for the lamp to warm up but the scanned images are much better. I miss having a manual feed paper tray. When I need to print envelopes it is still easier to fire up the old laser printer than to put envelopes in the paper tray of the Brother. A problem cropped up early on where the Brother wouldnt print after using the scanner function unless it was unplugged for a couple of minutes, then plugged back in.

Checking Brothers web site revealed that a firmware update was available. Since installing the update the unit has performed flawlessly. I used to design printers for IBM years ago. It is amazing how much functionality has been stuffed into this AIO for so little money. Buy one! Please try again later. Please try again later. Pros Full 11x17 scanning surface, great for scanning portions of full size drawings. Dual paper trays, didnt realize this when I ordered it, great surprise. Quick, especially for an inkjet. I havent timed it but it makes short work of 11x17 Gannt charts project schedule. Maybe the ink level sensors are optimistic, but Ive run off maybe 50, 11x17 Gannt charts and another dozen or so 11x17 plan prints, and its yet to show a dent in ink levels. Quiet, cannot hear it over the air conditioning although the AC is pretty loud.

Setup was a breeze, im an exIT professional, but Im pretty sure that anyone with basic network awareness can set it up. I was short a network cable so I connected to the wifi, set a static ip although it initially grabbed one via DHCP and then ran the installer, which located the printer and installed flawlessly. Cons barely Its has a rather large footprint. Its not really a con since its large size is a side effect of the large scanning surface, just make sure you have room for it. Its only 4 color. Print quality for business printing is fine, but I havent done any photographs but im not expecting much from a 4 color printer. I set it up to work wirelessly, and it was a piece of cake to install on both a Vista machine and an iMac. I was able to print a photo from an SD card without much difficulty even cropped it and made several other picture adjustments. The 11x17 size is crucial for us because we print 11x17 charts for use as training materials. The printer has thus far just worked. Some cons but no dealbreakers The printer wakes up far too often to keep the ink cartridges calibrated. We only print to this printer in large batches so we now keep it turned off most of the time to avoid wasting electricity and possibly machine life. Also, the ink is ludicrously expensive compared to our old color laser jet though that requires doing a lot of printing because the upfront cost of the LJ toner is high but produces more pages. For us though we only need to print in color once in a while so its not a dealbreaker for us. Finally, the print quality of a picture on the SD card was not overwhelming despite using highgrade kodak glossy picture paper.

I didnt try printing other pictures from other cameras this is not the purpose of the printer for us and I didnt try printing to the paper recommended by Brother so I cant say for certain if this is a problem compared to similar color inkjets. I set this up on my wired network very easily I didnt try the wireless. The fax works fine even over VoIP service, the printer is great. The scan to media feature is great if my wife wants to scan something, she can put a thumb drive in, scan directly to that, and leave me alone. The ADF that handles 11x17 is awesome. Since it is networked, I can scan straight to any computer in the house or to email or ftp if I want and I can print from any computer too. When you use 11x17 in either paper tray, that tray

sticks out further than the front of the machine body. The stock photo shows a piece of paper sticking out about as far as the 11x17 tray does. The only real bug is that the device cannot determine paper size not the paper in the tray not the size of the paper on the flatbed not the size of the paper in the ADF. When you insert paper into the paper trays, you have to also go through the on screen menus and tell the printer what size you put in not unusual. When you scan or copy ADF or flatbed, the device uses the default size no matter what you feed in. The manual has the same problem as all Brother machines it does not cover scanning. Not at all. I wish I had played with it a little more on photos before I made the moderately derogatory comment below because since then I have found the photo settings in the print setup screen and it prints excellent photo quality. It is frugal with ink and the replacement ink is priced well relative to HP. I have run a lot of paper and ink through this thing and it has performed flawlessly. The scanner is excellent from either the glass or the Auto Document Feeder and the ADF handles moderately dogeared paper well. My slightly older and much more expensive hp has trouble with even the most pristine paper. In short, I highly recommend this allinone. I was surprised to find that very few printers in that size range ware rated very high by their users, yet they were pretty pricey. So I was really pleased to find a multifunction 11x17 printer with an 11x17 flatbed scanner. I was skeptical at the relatively low price but encouraged by the mostly poitive reviews it received. I ordered it from Amazon and, as usual, it arrived on time, well packaged and in perfect condition. I have used this printer for about two weeks now and my application is engineering and technical graphics.

I have to say that this unit has exceeded my expectations and I would highly recommend it. I have no allusions that this would be the best choice as a central document center for a high volume workgroup where it would get abused, but for my small office where it is networked with two computers it is a genuine value. I found it easy to set up on my wired network, and very easy to use. I agree with other reviews that the colors are not as vibrant as you would want for a quality photo printer but for technical documents it is very satisfactory. The first page out is a little slow but after that it zips right along. The scanner captures images very accurately, the user interface is very intuitive and the construction is sturdier than I expected for the price.
